

Munich Piano Competition – General Provisions

1. The Munich Piano Competition is open to pianists of all nationalities and ages.

Online application form should be completed no later than **December 15th, 2021**.

Applicants are obliged to submit online, along with the Application Form:

- a copy of the applicant's birth certificate (or equivalent proof of age),
- a colour photograph (suitable for publishing),
- a proof of paid application fee – remittance slip (see instructions under §15 below),
- please specify the country, city, school and teacher
- enclose exact Competition Program with exact timings
- attach a recording of applicant's performance (unedited video web-links such as YouTube link in the Application Form) in accordance with the following restrictions

2. The Competition consists of **1 stage** that's being held online.

3. The Program is performed by the **free choice** of the candidate and must consist of 2 or more different pieces.

4. The entire Program in all categories must be **performed from memory**. All recordings that fulfil the requirements are accepted, even from other competitions, concerts or recitals.

5. The candidates are divided into the following **categories** according to their age:

Category A:	9 and younger	(born post-2011)	duration 4-7 min
Category B:	10 & 11 years	(born 2010 & 2011)	duration 5-10 min
Category C:	12 & 13 years	(born 2008 & 2009)	duration 8-15 min
Category D:	14 & 15 years	(born 2006 & 2007)	duration 10-18 min
Category E:	16 & 17 years	(born 2004 & 2005)	duration 12-20 min
Category F:	18 & 19 years	(born 2002 & 2003)	duration 15-25 min
Professionals:	33 and younger	(born post-1988)	duration 20-35 min
Music lovers*:	no age limit		duration 15-30 min

*this category is for all music lovers who do not study but play piano as a hobby

Underage contestants must be accompanied by an adult. Competition will not take any responsibility in safeguarding minors.

Time limits must be strictly observed! The Jury may disqualify the contestant for not complying with the time limit, each contestant will be stopped upon exceeding the time limit.

6. Participation fees:

- Categories A & B: 30€
- Category C: 40€
- Category D: 50€
- Categories E & F: 60€
- Professionals and Music lovers: 70€

Participation fees are non-refundable.

7. Competitors who wish to compete for the **Special Award (Contemporary)** must perform Obligatory Piece or a contemporary composition written after 1950. Three contemporary pieces that can be **downloaded from the official Competition website** are recommended.
8. **The Competition Jury** will be comprised of internationally recognised musicians and pedagogues.
9. The Competition Jury will work according to the **Competition Jury Manual™**. The Manual will be available to any interested party. The Manual respects the highest "conflict of interest" standards, articulates the pianistic and interpretative demands for the awarding of the prizes offered, and harmonizes the process of numeric scoring, marking and ranking of the competitors with the intrinsic criteria of the artistic profession and piano performance.
10. Competitors are not allowed to communicate **in any way with any member of the Jury**, outside of the official schedule, **until the end of the entire Competition**. Competitors may be allowed communication with the members of the Jury (according to the official schedule) for the purpose of suggesting further development initiatives - the schedule of such a session will be publicly announced.
11. **A member of the Jury who is related to a competitor**, or has had (institutionally or privately) any sort of teaching contact with a competitor, with or without reimbursement for the tuition provided, and regardless of the number of lessons given, cannot score, mark, or rank that particular competitor. Competitors are obliged, upon request from the Competition Secretary, to specify in the Application Form the names of the Jury members with whom they have had such pedagogical contact, and/or the members of the Jury to whom they are related. Competitor who has had such pedagogical contact with more than three Jury members, or is related to them, cannot participate in the Competition.
12. The Jury's **decisions are final** and are not subject to appeal.
13. **By processing the Application Form online, competitor accepts** all terms and conditions of this prospectus, the Jury Manual rules and regulations, as well as the decisions of the Competition Jury.
14. **Rating System:**
 - First prize: 95-100 points
 - Second prize: 85-95 points
 - Third prize: 75-85 points

Participation certificate/Diploma: 65-75 points

15. **Awards and prizes:**

Three best ranked contestants *per category* will receive **Henle Urtext edition scores**.

Selected participant(s) will get an opportunity to play a **concert in Nymphenburg Castle in Germany**.

Prize for the best *contemporary* piece: **Henle scores & Summer Academy scholarship**.

Based on the audience voting and online watching will be given the *Audience Award*: **Henle Urtext scores & Summer Academy scholarship**.

16. The Competition administration will forward information about **the accommodation options** to competitors.

17. The Piano Competition will be monitored by music critics, journalists, managers, and other persons, reporting on the Competition's progress in the media. The entire Piano Competition, as well as the Competition Jury sessions, will be **open to the general public**.

18. The Competition reserves **the right to record**, videotape, and broadcast the entire Piano Competition (including internet-transmission), without payment to the competitors. Recordings are the permanent property of the Competition and it is free to use them as it wishes and are free to be used by the Competition for any public occasion.

19. First-prize winners (in all the categories) are obliged to **remain at the disposal** of the Competition Management Programme for possible performances for a period of five days following the end of the Competition. If invited, awarded competitors accept to perform at the Gala Opening of the next edition of the Competition without a fee.

Jeopardising of this rule can result in the prize being withdrawn. Accommodation and related expenses will be covered by the Competition. No fees will be paid to competitors in this regard. Other arrangements between winners and the Competition Management Programme will be subject to a separate Contract.

20. Some foreign nationals will need a **visa** for their entry into Germany. Expenses for visa issuance are to be covered by the competitors themselves.
